**Guidelines for Residents**

**Issued on May, 6<sup>th</sup> 2020**

QUERY	CLARIFICATION
1. Industrial Permissions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As per New GO no.1003, dated 5th May, 2020 In Non containment areas of Red zone district/GBN, "After getting self-declaration from Industrial units, Authorities/GMDIC shall put up permitted list (as per MHA) Industries which are allowed to operate, for which orders to operate shall be immediately issued".</li> <li>• Those industries who have got permitted through portal / email need not apply again and can start operation immediately.</li> <li>• It is clarified that as per the government order "Mobile Phones and accessories" are covered under "manufacturing and IT hardware".</li> <li>• Whether or not ITES is covered under "Manufacturing of IT hardware" or "Private offices" has been referred to the Government.</li> <li>• The government is committed to ensure all permitted industrial activities can start with seamless interface and transparency.</li> </ul>
2. Do the workers/ Employee working in Industrial units needs any separate passes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No.</li> <li>• ID card issued by the Industrial Units who have been permitted shall suffice.</li> <li>• In case of industry employing 50 or more workers, they have to have dedicated vehicles, the registration no's to be intimated to DCP Traffic</li> </ul>
3. Regarding private offices	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As per MHA Guidelines private offices shall work with 33% of their total work force. They do not required any separate permission for this purpose.</li> <li>• They do not need any separate pass they can go to office with their valid ID card issued by Respected Offices.</li> </ul>
4. Government offices	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As per G.O. U.P. Guidelines</li> <li>• They do not need any separate pass they can go to office with their valid ID card issued by their respective departments/ Competent Authority.</li> </ul>
5. Closure of Interstate and Inter district borders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Closure of Interstate and Inter district borders shall remain in force as per previous order. No relaxation has been made in this regard.</li> </ul>
6. Guidelines on perimeter control of containment zone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inside containment zones, only Essential/emergency goods, services are allowed.</li> <li>• All other Permitted activities applicable for Non Containment zone only.</li> <li>• No movement of person allowed in and out of containment zones except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services.</li> </ul>

7. Guidelines with respect to essential services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Apart from emergency services, following essential services are permitted up to twice a week in society. RWAs are requested to fix days for specific work- Electrician, Plumber, Repair/Maintenance of Fan, RO water purifier, AC, Fridge, Washing Machines, Internet/broadband They do not require any pass. <b>Note:</b> - It is advised that the service provider should try to optimise their visits and ensure that maximum services are done during one trip, so as to avoid multiple trips.</li> </ul>
8. Entry of Maids	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Considering the diverse views received, it is clarified, that RWAs can take a decision, after consulting their respective residents and consensus building, whether to allow/ not allow/ allow with conditions entry of maid/ house help. The following will be mandatory in case the maid/ house help are allowed or allowed with conditions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Maid/ house help can come only from non-containment zone.</li> <li>One maid/ house help can work only in one house.</li> <li>The RWA should make arrangements for thermal scanning of all maid/ house help entering the RWA premises.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
9. Guidelines on Residents to take walks Outdoors.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Not Permitted</li> </ul>
10. Advisory on pets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Pets to be taken out for walks minimum possible time (preferably not for more than 15-20 minutes). Residents to ensure sanitary measures be exercised during the time.</li> </ul>
11. Mobility of residents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Allowed for permitted Activities only.</li> </ul>
12. Guidelines on use of elevators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RWAs can regulate based on social distancing and capacity of the lift.</li> </ul>
13. Guidelines on access of staff (Car cleaners, Dhobies/Drivers etc.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Policy broadly Same as Point- 8 but dhobies are allowed to collect cloths from multiple household provided other criteria as provided in point No. 8 is fulfilled.</li> </ul>
14. Guidelines on use of common facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Not Permitted except in emergencies and permitted activities.</li> </ul>
15. Guidelines on delivery of utilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RWAs shall either develop an internal system for doorstep delivery mechanism for milk packets, fruits &amp; Vegetables, newspapers, groceries, etc. through volunteers or RWA employees or will necessarily permit doorstep delivery through external vendors.</li> </ul>
16. Guidelines on visitor entries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Not permitted except in emergency services. Residents are advised to not invite guests during the lockdown period.</li> </ul>

17. E-Commerce guidelines	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Allowed only for essential goods.</li> </ul>
18. Construction/Fit-Out Labour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Only In-Situ activities permitted.</li> </ul>
19. General guidelines on standards of hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Persons above the age of 65 years of age, with co- morbidities, pregnant women, and children below the age of 10 to not venture outside the premises of one's own home unless for medical emergencies and severe critical essential requirements.</li> <li>Guidelines provided from time to time by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GoI, UP Govt. &amp; Distt. Administration to be followed.</li> <li>Spitting in public places/any area shall be punishable with a fine.</li> <li>Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco in public places and common areas are not allowed.</li> <li>Residents to wash hands regularly with soaps/sanitizers and to wear a mask.</li> <li>Wearing mask is essential for visiting public places.</li> </ul>
20. Guidelines on health(COVID- 19 symptoms)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Regular monitoring to be done by residents of their health status.</li> <li>If any COVID-19 symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, etc. are detected, immediately must be intimated to the District Surveillance Officer/ Gautambudhnagar integrated control Room number- 1800-419-2211</li> </ul>
21. Vehicles Restrictions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Only 1 rider on a two wheeler and 2 passengers along with driver permitted in 4 wheeler</li> </ul>
22. Restrictions on movement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All non-essential / movement shall remain strictly prohibited between 7.00 PM to 7.00 AM</li> </ul>
